Hundreds of Local 5 members and the Summer Institute for Union Women (SIUW) rallied in support of the workers at The Ilikai Hotel, a subsidiary of Aqua-Aston Hospitality. They are working more for less. They are paid \$3.51/hour less than the union hotel workers across the street, and they have to clean rooms that are much larger with full-sized kitchens.

We were voted Hawaii's Best Union for the second vear in a row! Mahalo to our Local 5 members for making this possible. We proudly serve our state, our country, our economy.



Workers from Rumfire in Sheraton Waikiki delegated human resources and delivered a petition signed by over 75% of their room demanding respect in the workplace. They had a follow up delegation with management to demand respect on the job. Stay tuned for updates on the workers' next steps to unite, build power, and create positive change in their workplace.
